

BACKGROUND:

- In 2016, the IDWeek Program committed to ensure gender equity in speaker sessions
- Intentional effort not explicitly extended to underrepresented racial/ethnic groups or other forms of diversity in specialty

METHODS

 Evaluated IDSA-provided speaker and membership demographics from 2013-2019



AIAN: American Indian/Alaska Native NHPI: Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander





WOMEN SPEAKERS:

 $38.6\% (2013) \rightarrow 52.1\% (2019)$

(41 % of 2019 IDSA membership)

PHARMACIST SPEAKERS:

 $2.4\% (2013) \rightarrow 5.1\% (2019)$

(5.4% of 2019 IDSA membership)

SPEAKER GENDER EQUITY ACHIEVED!

Intentional efforts to diversify IDWeek speakers must now move <u>BEYOND</u> gender to include other underrepresented groups in our specialty
